


The Real Rider Cup



RIDER:

TOM MORLEY, a native of England, has deep roots in Thoroughbred racing with several family members involved in the industry. His late uncle, David Morley, was a multiple Group 1 winning trainer. Cousin Henry Daly trains horses for jump racing and also has several Group 1 wins to his credit. Two cousins are bloodstock agents, and Tom's father is an active owner.

Tom started his own career with a job as pupil assistant to noted trainer Ed Dunlop. Upon graduation from Newcastle University, Tom was selected for the Godolphin Flying Start program, which he completed in 2006. He worked as an assistant trainer for Jeremy Noseda in the U.K. for four years and then for Eddie Kenneally in the U.S. for eighteen months. In 2013 Tom took out his own trainers' license and set up a stable at Belmont Park. His best year to date was in 2016 when he campaigned Haveyougoneaway and picked up his first Grade 1 in the Ballerina Stakes at Saratoga.

Tom and his wife, NYRA racing analyst Maggie (Wolfendale) Morley, reside in New York with their young daughter, Grace.

Tom will wear the silks of his sponsor, owner Rob Masiello. Rob began his involvement as an owner through West Point Thoroughbreds and was a member of the ownership groups of multiple Grade 1 winners Ring Weekend and Twilight Eclipse; the latter competed in the inaugural Real Rider Cup in 2017. Actively involved in Thoroughbred aftercare, Rob was elected to the Board of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation in the fall of 2017.
